UPDATES

Thursday, September 9, 2021

- Of special interest to the NEMO RPC, the MHTC held a special workshop session following the regular September meeting to address asset management and low volume, minor road investment.
- The Asset Management Deficit Program is adding \$15 million a year over the next three years to address pavement quality, with roughly \$4 million headed to the Northeast District maintenance program in 2022 and again in 2023 and \$3.3 million in 2024 for a total of \$11.3 million.
- An extra \$10 million annually is heading into the STIP to address these same concerns. The program will add \$2.7 million in projects to the STIP for the Northeast District in 2022 and again in 2023 and 2024. New to the discussion was the SB262 Condition Deficit Program, resulting from the newly approved fuel tax increase, which will use the same distribution formula for a second installment of \$15 million annually statewide (bringing the annual statewide investment to a total of \$40 million). It is projected to infuse \$4.05 million into the Northeast District STIP programming in 2023 and 2024 for a total annual Northeast District investment of nearly \$11 million in 2022-2024.



"That 30 point disparity in condition in our low volume roads is really, substantially outside of any reasonable boundary that our citizens should be subjected to."

Missouri Highway and Transportation Commission Workshop

- MoDOT Chief Safety and Operations
 Officer Becky Allmeroth praised the new
 Maintenance Management System which
 she says is now allowing Maintenance to
 clearly demonstrate the need for
 additional funding and she said as a result,
 for the first time in the last 15 years,
 operations received a bump in funding.
- She highlighted the 2010 reduction in maintenance facilities, when MoDOT went from 281 down to 167, closing roughly 40% of its maintenance sites.
- While the operations budget remained basically unchanged since 2008, she noted that inflation had reduce that buying power by nearly 50% in the same time frame due to higher costs.



"I've been here in operations for 26 years, and probably for 20 of that we've been saying, we need more money, we need more money in operations, but it was very hard to quantify here is exactly what we need and here is what our gap is. I couldn't be more thrilled to have this system in place to do that," she said.

Missouri Highway and Transportation Commission Workshop

- Director McKenna addressed the logistical concerns for maintenance, which he stated was operating beyond capacity.
 As a result, he stated much of the additional asset management deficit funding would go into the STIP to be performed by contract labor.
- Commissioner Terry Ecker, expressed frustration that more funding was not targeting the worst pavement conditions in northern Missouri.

"It's pretty significant to move large parts of the system 15% and 10%. To do more than that in a three-year period, I think it is going to pretty difficult, mostly because of capacity of our folks and the contracting industry."

"Keeping a road in good condition is cheaper ultimately than chasing first all the failed roads. It's counter intuitive, but in the pursuit of applying so much money to the worst condition roads, and I know this is a frustrating thing to hear, we would lose more roads that are in *good condition and they would work* themselves into a poor condition at a rate higher than we could keep up with. That is what asset management does. It is horrible public relations, but it's the best financial application of limited resources in managing a large system."

- MISSOURI FUEL TAX
 SENATE BILL 262
- FEDERAL INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT JOBS ACT


SB 262 could increase transportation funding by \$450+ million once fully implemented, \$330 million a year to MoDOT's State Road Fund and \$125 million (30%) to cities and counties for local projects.

Missouri is expected to receive \$6.5 billion for federal highway programs and \$484 million for bridge repairs and replacements over the next five years as part of the \$1.2 trillion federal infrastructure bill recently signed into law.



Federal Infrastructure Investment Jobs Act

- Missouri is projected to receive \$6.5
 billion for federal-aid highway
 apportioned programs and \$484 million
 for bridge replacement and repairs
 under the Infrastructure Investment and
 Jobs Act over five years
- Missouri can also compete for the \$12.5 billion Bridge Investment Program for economically significant bridges and nearly \$16 billion of national funding in the bill dedicated for major projects that will deliver substantial economic benefits to communities.
- \$674 million over five years to improve public transportation options across the state and airports in Missouri would receive approximately \$246 million for infrastructure development over five years

New Funding

- Based on review of the new IIJA funding, AASHTO is projecting that Missouri could see a 30% – 45% increase in funding to the core formula program.
- In a recent interview with the Missouri Independent, MoDOT Director McKenna indicated the extra funding will be directed to the state's Unfunded Needs List.

- NEMO RPC accounts for 8% of the project funding in the Northeast District and 0.3% of the project funding statewide



ASSET MANAGEMENT

Improving Pavement Condition, Resurfacing Rough Roads

- New asset management deficit funding has allowed the northeast district of MoDOT to bump the lane miles of minor route resurfacing in the district each year from 250 to 350 miles total each of the next three years.
- Low volume resurfacing has increased from 0 miles to 100 miles in the district as well.



The MoDOT Northeast District report shared the data pictured above with the Missouri Highway and Transportation Commission at the August 4, 2021 meeting.



A total of 35 projects were eligible for prioritization by each of the 17 current TAC members (Schuyler County has one vacant TAC seat).

Each TAC member was asked to rank 12 projects as HIGH priority (5 points); 12 projects as MEDIUM priority (3 points) and 11 projects as LOW priority (1 point) and submit the scoring prior to November 15th.

Above are the final prioritization scores for the 35 NEMO RPC TAC priority needs based on needs rankings submitted by participating representatives prior to November 17, 2021.

Multimodal projects do not compete versus road and bridges for funding. Sidewalks, airports, rail and river ports are funded thru separate federal and state sources.

There are 9 identified projects. Please rank 3 HIGH; 3 MEDIUM; and 3 LOW.

The NEMO RPC Transportation Planner dropped the ball and didn't get this list distributed with the TAC Needs list for scoring.

You can score them now on your individual score sheets and he will tabulate and produce the list for final vote to submit to MoDOT, or the TAC can discuss the projects and work jointly to rank from #1 to #9.
